## Chief Mwanachingwala in Chizoma



A very special thank you to the Chief for his blessings on us by giving us permission to start a new ministry in the village of Chizoma, and to Mum Judith Mazakaza for making her family plot available to us. Zambia is divided up into chiefdoms. We live in the chiefdom of Chief Dangelica in Mazabuka, but drive about 20 miles into the bush to reach our new church plant. **There are 7 other villages in which we can plant churches from this central location!**

## Our new church plant in the village of Chizoma



This is the beginning of our new church plant in Chizoma, Emmaus Road Baptist Church- Chizoma campus. All of our churches will be Emmaus Road from our parent church in Mazabuka due to how we are taxed, but each is identified by their location. Sundays find about 20-25 people there now, but Tuesdays have a larger number. Why? There is a large SDA influence here and they will not meet with us on Sunday as this would be tantamount to branding themselves with 666. But.....they'll come on Tuesdays for Bible study! Our team is here all day on Tuesdays to teach the Word in 3 different locations in the same village. **Pastor Alfred Siachababa** is the pastor of this church.

## Emmaus Road Baptist Church—Kabobola campus



The ministry in Kabobola (meeting at St. Columbas school) continues to grow under the leadership of **Pastor Joseph Muyeyi**. We rent two rooms in the school, one for adults, and one for children. We received a message from the church after coming home on furlough that they are continuing to get visitors, including a blind man they have led to the Lord. Praises! It is rainy season now, but the people remain faithful to come even though they are walking in heavy rains. After completing the new buildings for Chizoma and Chilala, we will search for a plot for a permanent building for this church also.

## Emmaus Road Baptist Church—Chilala campus



The second of our "urban" ministries, Chilala, is where we have actually already purchased the plot. Building of a permanent structure will begin as soon as we return. We started the foundation, but the rains absolutely drowned us. Pray for a new pastor for this plant. The families continue to meet here (even in the heavy rains), study their Bibles together, sing, and pray. We are discussing this area with a Zambian pastor now, but cannot make a decision until we have returned from our furlough. Our team continues to go here on Saturdays for children's outreach. Maybe they need to do both on Saturdays, preach and teach. Mmmm? Praise Him, teach and preach Christ crucified regardless of the day!

## New Deaf Ministries



These two young ladies were part of the Deaf Ministry of Livingstone Fundamental Baptist Church in Livingstone, which is where I met them. I found they were now living in Mazabuka when I saw them running down the street toward me with their arms and hands flying in Sign Language. They then started to coming to our church in Kabobola, and I would interpret for them. Now the ladies of Kabobola campus have come to me and asked me to start a Sign Language class for them so they too can reach the Deaf for Christ! Pastor Alfred also contacted me the week after we arrived in the States and told me they had found many Deaf in the village area of Chizoma, and he wanted to start a Sign Language class there. **Yes! Two new ministries for our sweet area of Mazabuka!**

## The Ladies of Chief Mwanachingwala's compound



This was the first area we began teaching in when we came to Chizoma. It is the compound of the Chief, and 5 of those ladies are his wives! The ladies of the town area are somewhat more educated than these precious ladies, and can read the information I give them. None of these ladies can read English or their own native language of Chitonga. So the going has been slower to help them get their Bibles by learning the Roman's Road, but patience has won out and 5 of them now have their own copy of the Word of God! Now to use the Literacy Council and teach them how to read. Wonderful when your textbook is the Word of God! We had to overcome the stigma placed upon us by the SDA, as they were telling everyone we were Antichrist. We give chitenge (wrap skirts) when the ladies learn the books of the Bible in order, but the SDA told them we had printed 666 inside the skirts and were wrapping them in Satanism. It has taken a while, but they now trust us and are learning their books! **Please pray for the spiritual growth of these ladies and that Satan would be bound away from this work.**

## Be it ever so humble



This is how you begin building a village house in Zambia. Clear first, then put up poles soaked in used motor oil (keeps the termites out of it), weave branches thru the support poles, then cover with wattle (mud and termite mound dirt). After the wattle has dried you skim it with cement mix. Then a grass roof (or tin from the missionary) This is Pastor Siachababa's new home in Chizoma until we can get back and help him build a permanent one from hand made cement blocks. **Humble my heart Lord.**

## And I'll huff, and I'll puff.....



Want to know how hard it rains and how hard the winds blow in Zambia? This WAS 25 feet of the front security wall of our house before the winds and heavy rains took it down. Not a picture you want to get when you're 12,000 miles away. Thankfully our guys are repairing it, but please pray the house stays secure until it is back up. This house is where we began our first meetings of Emmaus Road Baptist Church, so it is very special to us for that reason alone.
